CLUB DELEGATE FORMULA

Policy Manual, Article 8, Section B: Club Delegate Formula Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Clubs International and this District shall be entitled in each annual convention of this District to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each (10) members, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown by the records of the International office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members. Each certified delegate, present in person, shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote only on each question submitted to the respective convention. All eligible delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing within the District.

Montana District 37 grants full delegate status to each past district governor who is a member of a club in such district independent of the club delegate quotas.

Dues Adjustment Resolution Will Be Voted on at 2022 International Convention

Lions Clubs International supports clubs and members around the world so we can advance our global mission of service together. Our international support and the work of Lions Clubs International is fueled by the international dues of our incredible members.

In recent years, it has become increasingly clear that the services Lions Clubs International has been able to provide to members with the available budget is no longer in line with what Lions need and expect.

The International Board of Directors voted in October 2019 to approve an international dues adjustment resolution that would be voted on at the 2020 International Convention, but it was postponed due to the cancellation of our 2020 convention and the move to a virtual convention in 2021 as we adapted to the pandemic. The new dues adjustment model will be voted on at the 2022 International Convention in Montreal.

The Board of Directors undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, the board proposed to adjust dues \$7 over a three-year period.

Under the proposal, international dues would be adjusted according to the following schedule:

- \$3 increase on July 1, 2023
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2024
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2025

We realize the association has been reluctant to adjust dues over the years, and we have not adjusted international dues since 2011. The proposed adjustment will help cover our costs and allow us to suitably serve our members' needs. With that said, the Board of Directors did not take this issue lightly, nor are we minimizing the value of each dollar that our members contribute.

As we consider this dues adjustment, it is essential that we keep in mind that our global efforts and initiatives support more than 1.4 million members in 50,000 clubs around the world. Through the support of staff, we are able to serve globally on the level that we do, keeping members and clubs fully supported with service resources, training events and software, club operational support, hybrid convention, international meetings, language services, technology, Foundation support, leadership support, and everything else we have come to expect as Lions.

A dues adjustment will allow Lions Clubs International to provide improved support to Lions and to continue to invest in improving programs and digital products such as our website and MyLion. It will also allow us to invest in new programs such as the Learning Management System (LMS), development of new curriculum such as digital literacy, training videos, global advertising, marketing automation, digital and video storytelling and other tools and initiatives that will enhance our impact, our brand, and our membership.

Essentially, we have to decide whether or not we want Lions Clubs International to continue to grow and thrive. Lions is more than a way of life. It's also an investment of money, time, energy and passion. As with any good investment, the more we put in, the more returns we see.

I hope that you will see this adjustment as we do: as an investment in the future of Lions. Through your support, we can ensure that Lions are positioned for success in the future.

HELENA LIONS CLUB FOUNDATION DONATION TO HELENA BABE RUTH BASEBALL ASSOCIATION

The Helena Lions Club Foundation donated \$4000.00 to the Helena Babe Ruth Baseball Association to help fund a playground to be built at Ryan Park in Helena. This park has eight baseball fields, that young boys and girls will use all summer for Babe Ruth baseball and other activities for children. The playground equipment will be a new part of the park that people can bring their children to play on. The Helena Lions Club has sponsored a Babe Ruth team for over 60 years and this donation puts a cap on the \$38,000.00 the new playground equipment will cost. Installation will start in the spring of 2022 and the Helena Lions Club will help with the installation.

Over 4 Million Children are homeless because of the War in Ukraine.

Our Lions Clubs International Foundation has already dispersed over \$200,000 to Lions Districts in countries affected by this despicable act of aggression! Over 4 million children have been evacuated to Poland, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia and Austria and safer parts of Ukraine.

To date our Lions Clubs International Foundation has awarded over \$200,000 in grants to Lions Districts in all of the above countries. \$15,000 grants have been awarded to District 121 in Poland, District 119 in Hungary, District 124 in Romania, District 134 in Ukraine, District 122 in Slovakia, District 134 in Ukraine and District 114-O in Austria to name a few.

As the refugees move further into Europe, Lions districts welcoming numerous refugees will become eligible to request grants of up to US\$15,000 through the Lions Clubs International Foundation's Designated Grants for Refugees.

Lions stand for peace and understanding, and we unite through kindness to serve those in need. Your donation to LCIF's REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS FUND will help ensure that Lions are there to help them find the safety and security they desperately need.

Judy and I have made a \$100 dollar donation to this fund. We have made other donations to LCIF this and other years and have designated a Legacy Gift upon our deaths. I mention this so that you will understand we do not just ask for your support of Lions Clubs International Foundation, but that we are committed to its causes.

Already this year the United States has had numerous fires, floods and tornados. Districts, including our own, have requests for grants in the works or awaiting approval for community projects.

Thank you for your past and future support to meet the world's needs.

While our clubs have had local restrictions to our in-person gathering, our communities continue to need us. Some of our neighbors need us desperately.

New Year's Challenge:

FEBRUARY Service Challenge: CHILDHOOD CANCER

- -Work with a local restaurant to provide take-out meals to a family whose child is in treatment:
- -Drop off a casserole or meal for a family as above;
- -Call a grandparent who is worried about a child in treatment and just be a listening ear for them;
- -Reach out to family and friends and set a fundraising goal for a donation to LCIF in support of children's cancer services;
- -Donate plasma children with leukemia need plasma as well as blood on a regular basis;

Step 3. Report your service to your Lions Club Secretary. Follow-up and thank your fellow Lions for making sure your service is reported to MyLion.
