In 1985, he had the opportunity to spend more time at home with the family and bought a music store in Sidney, MT. He owned and operated the store for 28 years, until retirement. He and his wife, Barb, moved back to Billings to enjoy their newfound freedom. They have two children, Becky, living in Miles City, and Jeff, living in Williston, ND. They also enjoy their 6 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren whenever possible.

The following proposal for an increase in LCI dues was passed at the convention:

The Board of Directors undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, the board proposed to adjust dues \$7 over a three-year period.

Under the proposal, international dues would be adjusted according to the following schedule:

- \$3 increase on July 1, 2023
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2024
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2025

Hello Montana Lions,

We have been receiving many reports of Lions receiving scam emails and text messages. The emails contain requests to help families with various tragedies. It may appear that the email comes from a person that you know. The texts and emails will usually ask you to go buy some gift cards and then text or email the numbers. Asking to buy gift cards and send the numbers is **always** the sign of a scam. If the email or text has a web link in it **DO NOT** click on the link.

It does not appear that either the montanalions.org of Lions Club International web sites have been hacked. Most likely your information came from someone's personal computer being infected. If you have donated via a link or gift cards, please contact your local authorities.

While the final totals are not available, 2021-22 has been the most successful Lionistic Year in District 37 for Campaign 100 with over \$32,000 in donations. At the same time, we received a \$75,000 grant toward the purchase of a state of the art new ambulance for the Denton, Mt. Community to be delivered in August.

As this Lionistic Year ends we know that our work as Lions will not end. The needs of our communities, our district, our nation and our world not only will continue--but will expand. Our Lions Clubs International Foundation allows Lions Clubs and Lions Districts around the world to meet some of these needs with grants for Childhood Cancer, Diabetes, Disaster Relief, Disaster Preparedness, Community Recovery, Hunger, Leo Service, Quest, Sight First and Matching Grants resulting in the ability to explore countless opportunities for meeting these needs. At the present time we are working on a \$20,000 Community Recovery Grant for Red Lodge.

This year Immediate Past District Governor Mike Tobin will join me as District 37's LCIF C0-Chair. This will make a huge difference in helping clubs throughout District 37. Immediate Past International President Douglas Alexander will lead the Lions Clubs International Foundation for the next year. The new International Director team may make changes to grant programs availability and options and we will attempt to make any changes known as soon as we get updated information.

Thank you again for your support of the Lions Clubs International Foundation in the past as well as in the future. If your club has a project that requires more money than it has check with IPDG Mike Tobin or myself as to the availability of a grant. Most grants are from \$10,000 to \$100,000 with some requiring matching funds from the community.
