Asking to buy gift cards and send the numbers is **always** the sign of a scam. If the email or text has a web link in it **DO NOT** click on the link.

It does not appear that either the montanalions.org of Lions Club International web sites have been hacked. Most likely your information came from someone's personal computer being infected.

If you have donated via a link or gift cards, please contact your local authorities.
