#### WHY REPORT SERVICE

In presenting this topic to clubs, I often get the feeling that this is not a priority. I am going to give a few reasons why we ask the clubs to perform this task:

#### **Grow Partnerships**

Collaborating with other organizations in your community, i.e. Kiwanis, Rotary, etc, is a terrific way to increase the visibility of your service projects. When approaching potential partners, your club's service reports provide tangible evidence of your club's effectiveness to help persuade other organizations to join with you.

#### **Inspire Service**

Your reported service projects can be viewed within our district and around the world. That means your club's creativity and impact can inspire Lions and Leos to embrace new causes and serve in new ways. Reports also help Lions International staff identify best practices to share globally.

Inform Decisions

Documented club achievements reveal what is working and what is not. For example, what if your diabetes education program is growing in attendance, but your annual club fundraiser is shrinking? Reviewing past service reports helps your club make better decisions, including choosing service activities and setting realistic goals .

## **CLUB DELEGATE FORMULA**

Policy Manual, Article 8, Section B: Club Delegate Formula

Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Clubs International and this District shall be entitled in each annual convention of this District to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each (10) members, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown by the records of the International office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members. Each certified delegate, present in person, shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote only on each question submitted to the respective convention. All eligible delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing within the District.

Montana District 37 grants full delegate status to each past district governor who is a member of a club in such district independent of the club delegate quotas.

# **HOW CAN OUR FOUNDATION HELP YOUR COMMUNITY???**



What is your club Legacy Project that your community identifies your club with? If you do not have a Legacy Project- WHY NOT? If you do, are you promoting it?

Do you know what a Legacy Project is? A Legacy Project is one that brings attention to your club every time it is used or seen. It provides a gift to your community and it makes an impact on your community.

Montana communities have benefitted from club projects that are known by citizens and visitors alike. These include parks, senior citizen centers, an emergency generator, 2 ambulances, a handicap fishing dock, 100 readers for low vision students, a swimming pool as well as other projects unknown to us. Bozeman is building a new Food Bank and I am working with St. Vincent's Hospital on a cancer or diabetes grant for their new Hospital.

Do you have a sign commemorating a flood or fire that received a LCIF grant because of your club? Could you post new signs, dedicate a park bench or statue, or even sponsor a fountain in your local park. You might refurbish a park or playground, build a footbridge over a busy road, or even donate a vehicle to a community organization. Don't forget to seek partnerships with other organizations.



#### **LCIF VISION GRANT PROPOSAL**

I am requesting a grant for PlusOptix machines. We may be able to get up to 15 machines with a grant from LCIF. Cost: \$6,635 each w/printer and extra batteries. Club cost: \$2,122 w/grant. I have 5 clubs that want to participate. I need to have a request and a check for  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the club cost made out to District 37 PlusOptix Screeners by April 25<sup>th</sup> from them or any other interested club.

New requirements state a grant application has to have ½ of the matching funds in a bank account before the application can be submitted, and ½ of the matching funds in an account before the grant monies will be released. This is due to the fact that some grants have been released and some projects were not completed as approved. If for any reason the grant is not approved the monies received with be returned in full to each club.

No later than May 15 your club secretary should repot the incoming officers and directors. Make sure to provide email addresses.

**Standard Club Structure** – Help your Nominating Committee know what positions are available in the new Standard Club Structure. The sample structure includes the officers, board of directors and standing committees.

**Club Quality Initiative (CQI)** – The CQI is a strategic planning tool that helps clubs identify opportunities for improvement. The program features several steps to help club operations become more efficient and find new directions.

**Lion Portal Page** – As LCI prepares to launch the new Lion Portal, Lions can prepare for this new digital experience by making sure their information is correct in MyLCI. Get news and updates about the transition on the **Lions Portal Page**.
